
ROOT WORD Technique

Increase your English vocabulary with prefixes and suffixes






Let's continue our **ROOT Word** practice. This PDF will introduce 4 prefixes and 3 suffixes that you can use to understand new English words.

PREFIXES

pre - (in verbs, nouns, and adjectives) before

re - (in verbs and related nouns, adjectives, and adverbs) again

un - prefix (in adjectives, adverbs, and nouns) not; the opposite of

mis - (in verbs and nouns) bad or wrong; badly or wrongly



SUFFIXES

-able (in adjectives) that can or must be

-ness (in nouns)
the quality, state or character of

-ing suffix (this is added to verbs)1.Make the present participle(adjectives)2.Make the gerund (noun)

On the next page is a list of sentences that include one **bold** word. Use the **bold** word in the root word method. Try writing these words and their meanings in a separate document. (Writing helps to remember.)



New word (Root Word)

unbelievable (believe) I found the whole story bizarre, it was actually **unbelievable**.

undeniable (deny) The link between poverty and bad health is **undeniable**.

renewable (new) *We should try to use more* **renewable** sources of energy such as wind and solar power.

freshness (fresh) We guarantee the **freshness** of all our fruits and vegetables.



preheat (heat) Let's bake cookies! I'll preheat the oven.

reusable (use) *I try to use a reusable metal bottle and not plastic bottles.*

reimagine (imagine) *Many people were unhappy with J.J. Abrahams reimagining of the Star Wars series.*

qualifier (quality) *Canada lost it's World Cup qualifier match with the U.S.*

misunderstanding (understand) The meeting is a final chance to clear up any **misunderstandings**.



This PDF is only a small sample, there are hundreds of different prefixes and suffixes! Now you can use this method to increase your own English vocabulary. Use it to easily find the meaning of new words.
