

The PRESENT PERFECT tense

I **have** just **eaten** lunch so I'm not hungry.

TO EAT	
Present tense	eat
Past tense	ate
Past Participle	eaten



The PRESENT PERFECT tense is **have/has** +
the Past Participle *form of a verb*.

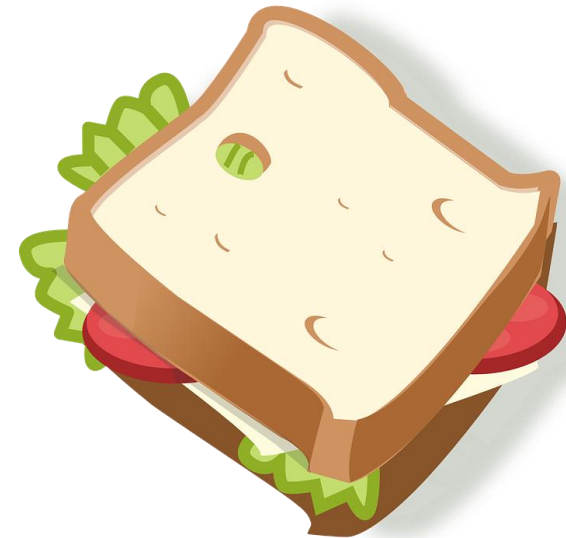
I **have** just **eaten** lunch so I'm not hungry.

TO EAT

Present tense eat

Past tense ate

Past Participle eaten



The PRESENT PERFECT tense is **have/has** +
the Past Participle *form of a verb*.

Erica's contact lens **has fallen** out.

TO FALL

Present tense fall

Past tense fell

Past Participle **fallen**

Let's help
her find it.



The PRESENT PERFECT tense is **have/has** +
the Past Participle *form of a verb*.

I **have lived** in Japan since 2006.

TO LIVE

Present tense	live
Past tense	lived
Past Participle	lived



The PRESENT PERFECT tense is **have/has** +
the Past Participle *form of a verb*.

Have you **been** to the new cafe on Front Street?

TO BE

Present tense is, am

Past tense was, were

Past Participle **been**



The **PRESENT PERFECT** tense
Connected Examples

There **has been** an accident.

The accident **has made** everyone more careful when crossing the street.

The number of car accidents in the city **has gone** up this year.

The police **have added** 25 traffic light cameras this year to catch drivers who don't stop.

The **PRESENT PERFECT** tense
Negative

For the **present perfect** *negative* we will use **haven't** or **hasn't** with the **past participle**.

TO START

Present tense	start
Past tense	started
Past Participle	started

This project is due tomorrow and I **haven't** even **started**!

The **PRESENT PERFECT**
tense *Negative*

haven't or **hasn't**
+ **past participle**.

Helen said that Will is going to transfer to our head office. Is that true?



TO HEAR

Present tense hear

Past tense heard

Past Participle **heard**

I don't know. I
haven't heard anything.

The **PRESENT PERFECT** tense

Questions



Have/Has + SUBJECT +
verb in the **past participle**.

TO SEE

Present tense see

Past tense saw

Past Participle **seen**

I left my coffee on the
table but now it's gone.
Have YOU **seen** it?

The **PRESENT PERFECT** tense *Questions*

Have/Has + SUBJECT +
verb in the **past participle**.

TO DRIVE

Present tense	drive
Past tense	drove
Past Participle	driven

Has ANYONE
driven an electric
car yet?



*Here is a common English question you may have heard before.

"**Have** you ever
been to _____?"



"Have you ever **been** to _____?"

The past participle of the verb TO GO is gone but if we talk about a visit, a trip or vacation to someplace where we have gone and come back, we use BEEN instead of GONE.



TO GO

Present tense go

Past tense went

Past Participle gone

TO BE

Present tense is, am

Past tense was, were

Past Participle been



I **have** **been**
to Sao Paulo
3 times.



Have YOU
ever **been** to
Canada?

I'm going to Tokyo Disney Sea
next week. **Have** YOU ever **been**
there?
