## Connect these 2 sentences with a relative pronoun

**Example 1**: I found a soft drink from Brazil today at a local store. I haven't had this drink in 12 years!

"I found a soft drink today from Brazil today at a local store *that* I haven't had in 12 years!"

"Brad, who was a TV actor, is now the president of the country."  (In this example the pronoun He is replaced by the relative pronoun who. Their position in the sentence is different because the relative pronoun comes right after the subject. In this case, the subject is Brad.)  1) George works at a company. 3:30 is **when** the meeting will start.

Meeting room 808 is **where** the meeting will be held.

Jason is the person **who** sets the meeting agenda.

I want to go to a restaurant **where** the staff are friendly.

Did you find the Brazilian soda **that** you were looking for? \*It's also fine to use *no* relative pronouns in this sentence. Did you find the Brazilian soda you were looking for? is OK too with no relative pronoun.

- 1) George works at a company **that** makes smartphone cases.
- 2) Quentin: "You got tickets for the game tonight! How did you get them?"

Spencer: "I have a friend whose brother works at the stadium."

- 3) Police are looking for 3 men who robbed an ATM.
- 4) The two people **who** were hurt in the accident are now in the hospital. (<u>The</u> is necessary here because the people are specific, they were <u>the</u> people hurt in the accident)
- 5) We had lunch at a cafe **that** is near my office. \*Remember the relative pronoun (**that**) is placed after the subject (*cafe*).
- 6) Helen saw an old house in San Francisco where Bruce Lee used to live.
- 7) I met a man today **who** said he has climbed Mt Fuji 39 times!
- 8) We stayed at a lovely Japanese Inn **that** my cousin recommended.
- 9) This summer I will visit <u>the</u> small town **where** I grew up. \*It's necessary to write **the** small town because it's specific, there is only 1 town where you grew up in this situation. Did you catch it? If so good for you!
- 10) I saw a guy at the bus stop this morning who looked just like you!
- 11) Lillian works in a clothing store **that** will close in 2 weeks.
