Fall In Love

You probably know the expression “fall in love.” We use the verb *fall* when we begin to love another person.

“From the moment she kissed me I **fell in love** with her.”

To make this expression even stronger we can fall **HEAD OVER HEELS** in love with someone. This means the love we feel is very strong. It is so strong we flip, our head goes over our heels.

“It was only our third date but I could feel myself **falling head over heels** for her.”

We can also BE **head over heels in love** with someone.

“Russell IS **head over heels in love** with Tessa. He never stops talking about how great she is.”



We can also *fall in love* **AT FIRST SIGHT**.

This means that as soon as you see someone you feel like you already know them and you love them instantly.

“I saw Jennifer across the dancefloor wearing a yellow dress and it was **love at first sight**.”

You can also **love someone/something with all your heart**. This shows how strong your love is.

“I would do anything for Hailey. I **love her with all my heart**.”

Make Love (to somebody)

This expression means to have sex
